

Glass Fusing - **Classroom Etiquette & Safety**

Class Hours: 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

- Students are asked to refrain from using equipment before class starts due to safety issues and consideration towards the instructors.
- Please allow Instructors 'set-up' time before class begins at 9:30 AM.
- Arriving after 9:00 AM to get your supplies to the classroom and set up your workspace is acceptable. Please refrain from starting projects, using equipment, and shopping for glass before class begins at 9:30 AM.

Be respectful of all material, tools, and equipment provided.

- Use equipment (grinder & strip cutter) with care and ask for assistance if you are new to the equipment or need guidance.
- The supply closet is available for students to shop for glass (only)
- All other materials and products in the supply closet are for the instructors' use (only).
- Measure your glass choices by Length & Width.
- Student invoices are used to keep track of your glass purchases by writing down the color, and size of the glass you are purchasing.
- There is a 'size-minimum' required for all glass purchases. See the instructor for assistance with these purchases.

Cleanliness is considerate:

- Clean up your work area and tools at the end of class & sweep up glass dust from desk.
- Always sweep up glass shards when crushing glass outside the classroom area.
- Return the rolling cart to the 2nd floor, so other classes and instructors have access to the cart.
- Food & Drinks are allowed but be considerate and dispose of trash & use recycling bins. Please clean up your liquid spills.

Safety First:

- There is a first aid kit in the bottom drawer near the sink.
- Personal carts and wagons can be stored in the hallway or in the 2nd floor lobby area to avoid crowded workspace in the classroom and eliminate tripping hazards.
- No glass down the sink. Trash cans are provided.
- Fans are available when using goo-gone.
- Safety glasses are recommended when cutting glass.
